THE GLORY OF EASTER

There was always something fun about Easter when I was growing up... dying eggs, getting a big basket of jellybeans and marshmallow peeps, and, of course, a visit from the Easter Bunny.

That came to a screeching halt one Saturday morning when my father took me to a community Easter egg hunt. As I recall, there were twice as many kids that showed up than they expected. The unhappiness of the parents resulted in a fist-fight with the giant pink Easter Bunny master of ceremonies.

As a five-year old I didn't particularly understand what was happening. All I remember was watching the pink Easter Bunny rolling around on the ground with some guy and being disappointed that Dad whisked me away before I could get any candy.

On the way home I could tell that my father was fairly horrified. Looking at me, he said something like, "That has nothing to do with Easter anyway!"

I couldn't believe my ears. How could my father speak such heresy? Of course Easter was about bunnies and peeps and chocolate eggs!

It was confusing when Dad started talking about crosses, thorns and nails. What I knew about Jesus

involved sheep, giving sight to the blind, and walking on water. My little heart loved that Jesus. But the very idea of Jesus suffering and dying on a cross was ghastly to my young ears.

As I grew in faith, I began to realize that it was necessary for Christ to suffer and die for my sins. His cross represents the only way for me to be in a relationship with a holy and righteous God.

In fact, there was a very important moment when I realized that Jesus was my personal substitute on the cross. As 2 Corinthians 5:21 says, "God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God." Some people refer to this as "the great exchange."

In other words, a perfectly righteous Jesus took upon Himself our perfectly unrighteous sins by taking our place on the cross. He didn't deserve to stand in the judgement which we deserved. Even so, this is the grace by which any of us may be saved.

Jesus put it this way in John 14:6, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." When we respond to His gracious gift of

forgiveness by surrendering our lives to Him in faith, everything changes.

The first thing that happens is that we are born again as we are adopted into God's family. That means that we are a "new creation" as we're told in 2 Corinthians 5:17.

The third thing that we begin to realize is that we will one day rise from the dead. Easter is the day we celebrate the resurrection of Christ from the dead. After His suffering, crucifixion and burial Christ conquered our greatest enemy... death. And for forty days He appeared to hundreds of witnesses throughout the Holy Land.

Having been made right with God, we now share in His resurrection power. We believe that just as Christ rose from the dead, so we shall one day rise with Him in glory!

And so, the incomprehensibly great power of God, which was on full display at the Garden Tomb where Christ lay, is now the power at work in those of us who believe and place our faith in Jesus. Christ is truly our King and Victor, seated "far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked" (Ephesians 1:21).

Easter means that love is stronger than death. Love "burns like a blazing fire, like a mighty flame. Many

waters cannot quench love; rivers cannot sweep it away" (Song of Solomon 8:6–7). It was for love that God gave His only Son (John 3:16); it was for love that Christ died on the cross (John 15:13). It is for love that the risen Lord intercedes for His children (Romans 8:34). Easter is fraught with love.

Easter means there is hope for us, after all. As Jesus said in John 14:19, "Because I live, you also will live".

Friends, Holy Week reminds us of Christ's great sacrifice... and the new life that we have in Him. I want to invite you to join us this Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday (combined w/Good Friday) and Resurrection Sunday to remember, revere and celebrate the undeserved goodness, kindness and love of our Lord who gloriously made our salvation possible.



Approximately 800 years B.C. the Temple in Jerusalem fell into great disrepair.




