Jesus calls His people to be different... dramatically different!

Different in what way? In Matthew 5:13 Jesus tells

us, "You are the salt of the earth..." and then in verse 14, "You are the light of the world..."

That's a pretty tall order to fill, but what does it mean to be salt and light?


On the one hand, salt was used in the Middle East to preserve meat to keep it from spoiling. As such, Christ followers are called to be preservatives of that which is good in the world from the inherent evils of fallen society.

On the other hand, salt was a scarce flavor enhancer and considered very valuable. Followers of Christ stand out as those who "enhance" the flavor of life in this world.

Christians, living under the guidance of the Holy Spirit and in obedience to Christ,

will inevitably influence the world for good, as salt has a positive influence on the flavor of the food it seasons. Where there is strife, we are to be peacemakers; where there is sorrow, we are to be the ministers of Christ, binding up wounds, and where there is hatred, we are to exemplify the love of God in Christ, returning good for evil (Luke 6:35).

In the analogy of "light to the world", the good works of Christ's followers are to shine for all to



Jesus warns us that salt should not lose its saltiness and that our light shouldn't be hidden under a bushel basket. Otherwise, what good is it?

Allow me to be political for a moment. We don't live in a country with Ceasar or a king. We live in a constitutional republic where each lawabiding citizen is given the

right and the responsibility to vote. The privilege, in other words, to make a difference in how we are governed.

cared for, our freedoms honored, our history properly estimated and esteemed, our future secured and our nation blessed under the mighty hand of God.

So, when we vote this Fall dear friends, we do so as Christ-followers who seek to represent Him well as salt and light. In this world we never vote for a perfect person or law. Sometimes we have to discern between lesser choices. Even so, we always prayerfully do so under the perfect guidance of God's Holy Spirit and His Word.

On a broader note, we will be exploring how Christians might best engage our culture when it comes to a variety of issues. Keep your eyes open for upcoming films and forums concerning "Christ and Culture" which will challenge us to think more deeply about what it means to be salt and light in a world that desperately needs Jesus.








SHARPSHOOTERS CLUB


Come and join the group on Sunday mornings for study.

WHAT'S A VERIFICATION CODE AND WHY WOULD SOMEONE ASK ME FOR IT?

When you log into your bank or credit card account, you might get a text message or email with a verification code. You then enter it at the login screen to confirm it's really you. That's a form of two-factor authentication that adds a layer of security to your account — and keeps would-be scammers and hackers out.

Your account password and a verification code work together, like the lock on your doorknob and a deadbolt lock. If you unlock the doorknob but not the deadbolt, you can't get in. Likewise, if you know the account password but not the verification code, you can't get in.

Anyone who asks you for your account verification code is a scammer.

Never share it.

FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION

The same goes for scammers trying to get into your account. To break into your account, scammers need both keys. That's why they try to trick you into sharing your verification code.

Scammers pretend to be someone you can trust, and say they've discovered a problem with one of your accounts — or that someone's using your identity. They may know some things about you and sound very convincing. They may even be very sympathetic to your problem: offering to help you set things right ... and then asking for your verification code to get into your account.

If you give them the code, they can log into your account and transfer all the money out of your savings or investment accounts.

Never give your verification code to someone else. It's only for you to log into your account. Anyone who asks you for your account verification code is a scammer.

If someone asks you for your verification code, don't engage. Hang up. Block their number. Stop texting them. Then report them to the FTC at ReportFraud. ftc.gov.

If you're worried there's a problem with your account, contact your bank, credit union, or investment advisor directly. Use a number you trust, like the one on your statement or in your app. Never use the number the caller gave you; it'll take you to the scammer.

GIFT CARD SCAM

There is a scam going around that has affected many churches, including ours. A scammer will send an email or a text claiming to be the pastor or a member of the church staff. They will then ask for gift cards to be purchased and the activation codes to be sent to them.

PLEASE KNOW THIS...

- 1. Your pastor will never ask you to purchase gift cards for any reason. The church will never contact you and request gift cards (or other purchases) of any kind, especially not through email or text messages.
- 2. If you have any doubts about an email or text message you receive please contact Pastor Cliff or the church office (623-975-9038). Never call a phone number provided in a potentially phony email or text message.
