

WIN... BUILD... SEND!!!

Several months ago, the Session of Grace Community Church adopted as our purpose statement the following word:

With PASSION for Christ and COMPASSION for people

Grace Community Church is called to:

WIN, BUILD, and SEND disciples for the Glory of God.

Like a compass reading, those twenty-four words set the direction for everything that we do here at Grace Community.

The first section of the statement speaks to our attitude or spirit with which we carry out our life together.

"With passion for Christ" is drawn from the greatest commandment where Jesus said we are to "And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength." (Mark 28:30) It is with a totality of our whole being that we are to love the Lord.

"With compassion for people" comes from the second greatest commandment according to Jesus, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Mark 28:31). We look at each other through the eyes of Christ. And our actions reflect His heart.

The middle section **"Grace Community Church is called"** defines the conviction that our purpose is wrapped up in more than a wish, opinion, or dream. Instead, we believe that it is none other than God Himself who has directed us to represent Him with a certain spirit and task in mind. We understand the "spirit" and "task" to be inseparably intertwined.

The task to which we are called is outlined in the third section with three key points. Each of these points represents an aspect of the Great Commission found in Matthew 28 where Christ begins by saying, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me."

He follows that statement in verse 19 by saying, "Go therefore and make disciples." This is what we are referring to when in the first point we say, "Win" people over. This means that everyone of us is to use daily opportunities to encourage others to accept God's gracious gift of salvation in Jesus Christ. In other words, to be "born again."

Christ then commands us to baptize those who have been won over as disciples as members of the body of Christ, the church. In verse 20, our Lord follows that up by saying, *"teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."* And so, the second point underscores our call as a church to constantly **"Build"** people up in the knowledge, faith and practice taught in Scripture.

Finally, we are to **"Send"** people out for Jesus Christ. This continues the cycle of winning people over that we find the first point. Just as others won us over to Christ, so we are sent out to win others to Christ. Thus, fulfilling the Great Commission of our Lord.

In other words, we are His ambassadors. We represent Him wherever we go and with whomever we speak. Whether it is across the street or across the ocean. We represent Him at the grocery store, on cruises, when we fly north as snowbirds... with our kids, our grandkids, friends or enemies.

Just twenty-four words very purposeful words in our statement, rooted in Scripture, help to define our purpose as a people... as a church. I want to encourage you to memorize those words. To always keep them foremost in your mind. And to look at everything that we think, say and do with these priorities in our hearts.

Ultimately, everything we do points to God as the one

deserving the glory. We worship & serve & learn & witness all to honor Him and magnify his Holy name.

MISSIONARY CRISIS RELIEF FUND*

Over the past ten years Hindus in India have become more and more hostile toward Christians and Muslims. The Hindu Nationalist Party under the leadership of Prime Minister Modi has been the prime motivator for ethnic cleansing/genocide throughout the country.

Tens of thousands of Christians in India have been run out of their homes, tortured and in some cases murdered. You may have heard of the Christian woman who was gang-raped and marched naked through the streets of Manipur.

Pastors, missionaries, evangelists and teachers have all become targets. Hundreds of pastors have been executed. Thousands of churches have been burned. And ancient Christian Cemeteries have been bulldozed under.

We, as a church, have been very supportive of one particular missionary who is currently one of India's leading theologians and Bible teachers. In fact, Pastor Cliff has worked with this friend for more than forty years and is currently the Chairman of the Board for the U.S.

Prior to the rise in persecution our mission had established more than 800 study centers throughout India. The purpose of these centers was to offer mature Biblical instruction to tens of thousands of house church pastors, missionaries, Bible translators and evangelists who could not afford it otherwise.

Currently, this friend and his wife are under threat both from the government and Hindu neighbors. While they have dual citizenship, their exit from India is complicated for a variety of reasons. A few of them include the questions of whether they would ever be able to return to India, will the Indian government target other staff and faculty of the mission and what funds will be available for them to survive on here in the United States as they did not require as much to live in India.

At the moment, our Elders have voted to establish a MISSIONARY CRISIS RELIEF FUND with the goal of raising a minimum of \$10,000 by August 28th to simply relocate our missionary friends. Our hope is that our friends will be able to continue their missionary efforts here in America as well as online to India until it is safe for them to return.

Please pray for our friends. Many of you know them by name. Pray for their safety and God's provision for them. Also, be sure to ask the Lord to guide you in how you might be of help. The situation is urgent. Anything that you can do to be of assistance would be greatly appreciated. If you have any questions/concerns, please speak with Pastor Cliff, Tim Tunnell, or Patti French.

GREAT NEWS... JOASH CHEST FUND VICTORY!!!



Praise the Lord!!! Thank you friends for being so supportive of the Joash Chest Fund.

Because of your generosity, by God's grace, we were able to complete our first major project from the fund known as "Raise the Roof!"

That's right, Grace Community Church now has a new roof! And the solar panels are being repositioned as this article is being written.

A point of clarification... we have a new roof on the front half of the building where the solar panels are located. Previously, our solar panels required hundreds of holes to be drilled into the tiles. This created leaks and places where refuse would collect causing water to back up.

For the time being, the Building and Grounds Team along with the Elders sensed that the crisis to be averted was with the front half of our building. Using a local, family owned, roofing company and solar service we replaced the paper and tiles, cleaned out the debris, cleaned and repositioned the solar panels (without drilling

any large holes), and installed new inverters (which will improve our savings by 20-30%).

The total cost of our project comes to \$45,178.

We're working hard at raising funds for our next project which is the replacement of much of our lighting and sound system in the sanctuary. It will not be long before we will be unable to use our current lighting system. The change of lighting over to LED will then create all kinds of complications when it comes to sound interference.


WHY READ THE BIBLE?

Jesus, soak our hearts in the beauty of your generosity and kindness so that we can overflow with grateful giving. For your sake, Amen.














THE JOANGET UPDATE



Donations to the Joash Chest Funds are just past the halfway point at \$77,810.06. As you remember, the goal is \$75,000 for Sight & Sound, and \$75,000 for the Roof.

Thank you for the generous support that you have given to this fund so far.

We have just completed some needed roof repairs. Approximately 40% of the roof has been replaced, and 4 new Inverters for the Solar System have been installed. The remaining funds will help us to begin upgrades on our deteriorating lighting and sound system. Hopefully, we will be able to finish the rest of the project in the near future.
