Over the last three years, in spite of covid19, we have seen our worship attendance and participation in church activities increase significantly. It seems like we see more new people every week... many of whom are sticking around.



As your Pastor, I am amazed with how I see

the Lord's hand at work in our congregation.

As our congregation flourishes, however, so does the use of our beautiful facility. Some of our founding members realize that much of our equipment, furniture and machinery is more than twenty years old.

Just in the past two years we've had to replace two of our twelve aging air conditioning units. Our sound and lighting systems in the sanctuary are not fully functional. The roof has sprung several leaks. And our carpeting is starting to show signs of deterioration. All of this is the normal kind of wear and tear that happens in the life of a house of worship.

In the Old Testament, there is a marvelous story of how King Joash and Jehoiada the priest wanted to renew and restore the Temple which had fallen into disrepair. had required of Israel in the wilderness. All the officials and all the people brought their contributions gladly, dropping them into the chest until it was full."

As the biblical account goes, the people were so enthusiastic in their giving that the chest was filled up over and over again, so much so that they were more

than able to cover the expenses of the restoration.






Choices and TPUSA Faith: The Perfect Partnership

BARBARA BROWN - DEACON NOMINEE

I was born in a suburb of Chicago, baptized in the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod and my family saw that we went to Sunday School and Church every Sunday. I was blessed with a God-loving Grandmother who shared her love of Christ with me. I was confirmed on Pentecost Sunday in 1958. The pastor laid hands on my head and read Ps 51 ". . .Create in me a clean heart Oh Lord . . ." It was if an electric shock went through me entirely from head to toe.

While I was a 'professed' Christian, attending church, I didn't know about the need for a personal relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ.

In 1962, I met Mark through my brother. I remember fearing he was Catholic: this was a big deal in my family . . avoid at all risks! On our first date I asked him if he believed in God and yes, he did. I asked if he attended church and yes, he did; First Lutheran Church in Blue Island, IL. Hurray, he would be acceptable to my family!

We were married in 1963. We moved to CA through a job of Mark's and we were alone with no family. It was a very tough time for us. In 1966, the Government intervened and drafted Mark as the Viet Nam war was raging. God blessed Mark by sending him to Italy. At the same time, I was a lost soul out in CA. I finally had to get my life in order and I moved back to Illinois. In 1968 Mark left the military; 1969 we purchased a home in IL and in 1970 and 1971 we had our daughter and son. It was an enormously stressful time as Christine was a hyperactive toddler and Aaron was born with many orthopedic and neurological issues. When I asked the doctor why, he said it was a defective egg. The guilt and anxiety were awful as I watched our son go through surgery after surgery.

Mark worked with a Christian man who led him to a personal relationship with Jesus. He would bring home The Good News and finally I accepted Jesus into my heart.

Life has given us many ups and downs but through the grace and love of God, we have weathered all through our dependance on him. Praise the Lord.

MARK C BROWN - ELDER NOMINEE

I was raised in a blue-collar family in a south suburb of Chicago. I was baptized as an infant and confirmed in the Lutheran Church at age 12. My family did not attend church very much while I was growing up.

I met my wife Barbara through her brother in September 1962. On our first date, Barbara asked if I believed in God and did I go to church. I said yes. She asked what church. I said Evangelical Lutheran Church in Blue Island, Illinois. Barbara was very relieved and I was immediately accepted by her family. She was accepted immediately by my family. Her family was Lutheran and attended church regularly. We were engaged in December 1962 and married in August 1963. My mother loved Barbara very much.

In 1968, I was working as an electrical draftsman in the power industry in downtown Chicago. I noticed three fellows sitting around a drafting table at lunch studying the Bible. I asked, and they agreed that I could join them. The Lord opened my heart to Him through studying with these guys and I became a born-again Christian.

A friend I worked with got a job offer with a large engineering company in Denver, Colorado. That caught my interest because I did not like Chicago or the weather. I mentioned it to Barbara and she balked at making a move because our son was under the care of Shriners Hospital for Children. There is no Shriners Hospital in Denver; the closest one would have meant traveling and staying Salt Lake City for all his needed surgeries.

Every morning before work I would have coffee and toast while I did my devotion and prayer. One morning I heard the Lord say to me, "I want you to move to Denver." I always bought the Sunday Chicago Tribune on Saturday evening but was not able to do it the week after the Lord spoke to me. So, early that Sunday morning I got the paper and after looking through the job section, a company in Denver had a full-page ad for local interviews in Chicago. It was the same company my friend had joined. I called them, had an interview, and was offered a job. We moved to Denver in 1978.

We found the Lutheran church was not meeting our needs for worshiping the Lord; we bounced around Baptist, Evangelical Free, Episcopal, Bible-based non-denominal churches for several years. Both Barbara and I missed the liturgical churches and found that the Episcopal Church fit our needs. Christ Episcopal Church, a Spirit-filled, God-loving and serving church, became our home.

After retiring in 2014, I was complaining about the cold and snow in Colorado. We liked Arizona's weather and after much prayer, in May of 2020 we made the move to Sun City Grand in Surprise.

We tried two Episcopal churches nearby and found them cold and unwelcoming. Dean and Gayle Arkema, friends from our previous community in Colorado, encouraged us to attend Grace Community Church. We immediately found the community of believers very friendly and spiritual. Pastor Cliff is a powerful preacher and gifted teacher. We both believe this is where the Lord has directed us and we are thankful to have joined GCC. We also believe the Lord is directing us to become more involved rather than just attending Sunday worship, thus after prayer and much thought, I have agreed to become an Elder and look forward to what God has in store for GCC and for the Brown's.

DIANE WILTON - DEACON NOMINEE



This is the year! Don't put it off!! Now is the time to read through the Bible in a year!


Will it be easy? Probably not. But the best things in life usually take great deal of effort and diligence.

The Bible is like no other book ever written. And it will change your life!

Written over a period of 1,300-1,500 years and spanning a vast number of generations, the Bible was written in places as diverse as Rome in the West, Egypt in the South and Mesopotamia in the West! No other book can claim the amazing geographic or ethnic diversity which you find in its origins.

Authored by approximately forty different people and edited and preserved by countless scribal schools and communities, the Bible preserves for us the writings of a vast array of personalities... kings, prophets, princes, fishermen, a doctor, a Pharisee, a tentmaker and tax collector, philosophers and poets, historians, zealots and military leaders to name a few. The Bible also uses all kinds of literary genres... narrative, poetic, legal and argumentative texts. It's really quite extraordinary!

The Bible is also unique in that it is translated from a number of different languages. Greek, Hebrew and Aramaic along with a little Ugarit. It is very diverse in its teachings which includes our understanding of God (as Triune), the Incarnation, the Atonement, Salvation, faith,

In all of ancient or modern literature there is simply no other book that comes even close in comparison to the Bible.

in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work."


The Bible is alive dear friends. It has legs... it chases after you until it changes you!


