THE PRETTY UGLY BEAUTIFUL CROSS

In high school I remember buying a cross to wear around my neck. It was cool. For some weird reason I thought it might attract girls. I know, how could your pastor admit to such a thing!? But it's true.

Some guy asked me why I wore the cross. "Uh, because it's cool and I go to church?"

He wouldn't relent. "You don't even know what it means to wear the cross do you?" It was more of a accusation than a question.

I don't exactly recall the nature of my reply, but his challenge planted some

questions in my brain. After I thought about it, it did seem kind of strange that I would wear an instrument of death around my neck as jewelry.

People at the time of Christ didn't think that the cross was a pretty thing. It was an ugly thing. In fact, it was so ugly that early Christians typically didn't use the cross as a symbol of the faith because crucifixion evoked the shameful death of a slave or criminal. It wasn't until 400 years after Christ's death that the cross became more of an acceptable public image for Christians.

The truth be told, the word "cross" was so ugly that to say to someone "May you be nailed to the cross" was synonymous with telling someone to "Go to Hell." As St Augustine once said, "the very word (cross) is harsh to the ears." Roman citizens were typically spared death by crucifixion because it was so horrifyingly, excruciatingly painful.



When Jewish leaders plotted against Jesus, Judas betrayed him, Herod and Pilate tried him, and the Roman soldiers executed him... it all led up to a cross. As Luke puts it in Acts 2:23, "Wicked men put him to death by nailing him to the cross."

But why did Christ have to die on a cross? There are many reasons for His sacrifice.

Acts 2:23 also says, Jesus was "handed over by God's deliberate plan and foreknowledge." So, God had a hand in this, but why?

Because our sins separated us from God who is wholly righteous in that He demands just payment for our sins... a payment we couldn't make. Instead, God the Father sent His only begotten Son to make the payment for us.

1 Peter 3:18 says, "Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God."

Paul agrees with Peter in Ephesians 2:13, "You who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ."

Our sins kept us far from God. The Bible doesn't mince words when it comes to human disobedience and its consequences. Paul says in Romans 6:23 that "the wages of sin is death." All humans stand condemned before God; our sins separate us from him whose character is pristine holiness and perfect justice.

When Jesus died on the cross for us a great exchange

took place. It was in that astounding act of crucifixion Jesus became our substitute by taking upon Himself the punishment for our sins and imputing to us His righteousness. This is the only way that our sins can be forgiven.

Paul says in 2 Corinthians 5:21, the one who "knew no sin, became sin" —our sin— so that we might receive mercy.

Mark 10:45 tells us that Jesus paid the price for our redemption when he "gave his life as a ransom in the place of many."

According to Romans 3:25, "God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement through the shedding of his blood," exhausting God's wrath against our unrighteousness.

Paul reminds us that Jesus's death in our place is of first importance and was in accordance with the Old Testament Scriptures in 1 Corinthians 15:3. His death fulfills the old covenant sacrifices, such as the sin offering, the Passover lamb, and the scapegoat of the

Day of Atonement. He's the Suffering Servant in Isaiah 53:5 who was "pierced for our transgressions."

Two texts from Romans make this clear: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Christ's death puts beyond all doubt the fact that God loves us. It assures us that no matter what life throws at us, we can trust that "he who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all... will also graciously give us all things" (Romans 8:32)

These are just a few of the reasons we can call the pretty ugly cross... beautiful. I trust that your heart will be fixed upon it as we approach Holy Week and Resurrection Sunday. Just remember, however, that the cross is now empty. Why? Because Christ is risen... He is risen indeed!

WHY READ THE BIBLE?


We should read and study the Bible because it is God's Word to us.




