

MERCY IN ACTION INTERNATIONAL

The 2nd Sunday in January, Grace Community had Bob & Ruby Hoke, come and share what God is doing through a Ministry called Mercy in Action, Intl. Through generous donations, over the past 20 some years, they have started an orphanage in the most severe slum area of Nairobi, Kenya, East Africa. The site consists of dormitories to house the children 24/7, a large kitchen with mess hall to feed them and class rooms to teach them.

Their goal, from the start has been to house, feed, cloth, and provide medical and hygiene needs for 1000 children. To date they are meeting these needs for approximately 850 children. In addition, they provide education for K through 12th grade, for each child. They are taught a Kenyan Accredited Educational Program. The best part of this ministry is the teaching of the children about Jesus Christ, giving them hope for a future. Every one of the children, regardless how long they stay, have a thorough knowledge of Jesus, as their Lord and Savior. Not all of the 850 children have a sponsor, but they are provided exactly the same benefits, as those who do have a sponsor.

From the start they asked for \$25 per month to support a child in K through 8th grade and \$35 per month for children in high school. That was more than 20 years ago and to date they are asking the same amount per child. No increase in 20+ years, that's pretty good orphanage management...

Their overhead of 2% is the Mercy in Action ministry. The Hoke's make two (2) trips each year to Nairobi, at their own expense.

Doesn't this sound like a ministry you want to be a part of? If you would like to begin supporting a child or children, there is a signup sheet in the foyer. Write your name, phone number, number of children you wish to sponsor and their age group. This information will be given to the Hoke's and they will contact you. Please be generous, it is truly a worthwhile ministry and may God richly bless you.
