A LASTING LEGACY

One of the sweetest, most generous men I've ever met was a guy named Leo. Leo was one of the custodians at my middle school in New Jersey. Somewhere in his midsixties he was short, quiet and unassuming.

Leo had a reputation for always helping the kids who forgot their lunch money or didn't

have any money for lunch. Sometimes, if Leo trusted you, he might look at you with a twinkle in his eye and suggest that you help out someone else in need.

This was strange thinking for most of the boys I hung out with. We were used to pinching our nickels and dimes to buy a candy bar or a milk shake. But for some odd reason we didn't want to let Leo down and we kind of liked being generous with the kids he pointed out to us.

One day, Leo directed my attention to a new girl and said, "I haven't seen her eat lunch in a week." Then, without giving me a choice, he tapped her on the shoulder and said something like, "Cliff wants to buy you lunch today."

Well, I must have blushed a thousand shades of red because that girl was pretty cute. And for the rest of the year, I shared lunch with Jenny. I guess that was a sweet little gift that Leo shared with me.

At the beginning of eighth grade we saw Leo less and less. Pretty soon we were told that Leo was very ill with cancer. We didn't know much about that sort of thing, but it sounded awful.

We wrote get-well cards, sent flowers, and earnestly prayed for Leo to get better. It didn't happen.



Midway through eighth grade Leo went home to be with the Lord. But when he departed this mortal coil he left something very important behind.

It was reported in the newspaper that Leo left his entire estate to his church. That included a little house located on the wrong side of the tracks. It also included over \$500,000... a staggering

sum of money for a custodian to leave behind in 1975.

The pastor of the church was quoted in the paper saying something like, "Leo loved Jesus, loved his neighbors and he loved the church. He was the kind of cheerful giver the Lord loves." I know this because the clipping is in my middle school scrapbook.

My folks didn't know Leo except through my stories. Even so, they buzzed with excitement over "Leo's legacy." I didn't know what that word meant.

My father explained that a legacy is what a person leaves behind to bless others when they are gone. He said that the first blessing of Leo's legacy was being generous with my fellow students. The second blessing of his legacy was teaching us boys to be generous with others. And the third blessing of his legacy was his generosity towards his church.

Dad explained that the money Leo left for his church would help them carry out a ministry that would change people's lives. He said, "One day you'll meet people in heaven who are there because Leo was generous." I never forgot that.

Friends, what we give in the cause of Christ can make an eternal difference in the lives of hundreds, if not thousands of people. St Paul once said in 2 Corinthians 9:6-7, "whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

Jane and I have learned to love to give generously. It isn't merely out of a sense of duty, but out of a passion for what we see Christ doing in and through His people right here at Grace Community Church. We don't need to thump our chests or trumpet what we give. God knows all about the amount and that's all that matters.

Ultimately, Jane and I look at our giving as a sacred act of worship to honor the Lord.

There are a multitude of good causes in this world we

could support, but there is no greater God-glorifying cause on the face of the earth to us than the cause of Christ... that His light and love goes forth, the good news is proclaimed, lives are changed, and the Church is blessed.

This is the lasting legacy Leo wanted to build. It's the same lasting legacy that every Christ-follower should pursue as we seek to bless the Kingdom of God on earth.

Beloved, Christ made us His ultimate cause... let us make Him our ultimate cause as we generously honor His holy name together.


VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

SANDWICH BOARD SIGN



JOASH CHEST FUND UPDATE

WOW!!! You did an amazing job helping to raise funds for our very first Joash Chest Fund drive. Thank you very much!

By God's grace, we were able to raise enough money to repair the roof (\$39,600)*, replace the power inverters for our solar panels (\$5,600), replace the sound board in the sanctuary (\$5,300) and upgrade our deteriorating lighting system (still in progress, \$25,000).


All told, our first effort raised \$80,455. Praise the Lord!

Good news... we are still accepting gifts for the Joash Fund. Your gifts will specifically be used for emergency repairs or replacements for our facilities. For instance, we currently have eight of our twelve air conditioning units that have never been replaced over the past twenty years. Replacing them costs about \$15,500 each!

Our hope is to build up our reserves to make relevant upgrades to our facilities, if and when, they present themselves.

Will we ever raise Joash Chest funds for special projects in the future? Sure, we will, but for now all funds will go into a specially designed reserve account to ensure the long-term care of our facility.

*The front half of the roof was replaced after consultation with several roofers. The back half of the roof is in good condition for the time being. By God's grace we saved more than we initially expected.


